Bordeaux 2009....a partial eclipse of 2005

7th April 2010...After six days visiting 55 châteaux and tasting more than 300 wines, Berrys' buying team have returned a verdict on Bordeaux 2009 and they say it's "brilliant".

Berrys' Sales Director, Simon Staples, says 2009 is not better than 2005 across the board but this vintage will be the finest some châteaux have ever made.

"Certain châteaux have crafted some truly exceptional wines that match, top, and in few cases eclipse, their amazing 2005s," says Simon, adding: "Is it better than 2005 across the board? No. The dry whites are a little too generous, plump if you will; delicious to drink this summer and next but I'd be concerned about the freshness beyond that."

He says: "The Sauternes are generally a little light, with a few exceptions, and quite a lot of the Merlot-dominant wines of the right bank, who left their grapes on the vines a tad too long, are off balance with very harsh, high alcoholic levels. Also, the lesser red wines of 2009 are not as soft and yummy as their counterparts from 2005."

On the subject of pricing, Simon says: "My instinct says that this is not going to be a swift, painless and cheap few months that lie ahead of us all. I say this as a wine lover and as a Merchant. Virtually every château will await Parker's declaration at the end of this month, don't get me started on this debacle, and the very best will await the unveiling of their new babies at VinExpo held in Hong Kong at the end of May. Some will get it spot on, others will completely miss their price and timing of release slot, and others will release at the right price and double it overnight. What I do know is that whatever happens, those who buy will end up with some totally sublime wines in their cellar and at all price points."
